Whenever discussing the subject of hospitality the woman best known for her hospitality was the Shunammite woman who took in a stranger named Elisha, 2 Kings 4:8-10. As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. " {1 Peter 4:9,10} How does one practice hospitality in a grudging way? By complaining and murmuring about having to do something for another brother or sister. If our spirit is wrong when we practice hospitality it profits us nothing and really not the other person because it is not done from a heart that is sincere. What the church needs today are brethren who are lovers of hospitality.
