So we can rightfully conclude that all men have the sin problem. Now we must find a remedy for this problem of sin. What saith the Scriptures?

"And according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission. {Hebrews 9:22} What kind of blood?

"For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins. "{Hebrews 10:4} Animal blood could not do it.

"For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's." {1 Corinthians 6:20} We could not buy ourselves back. Shedding our blood cannot do it.

"In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace" {Ephesians 1: 7}

"But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." {Romans 5:8}

"And from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler over the kings of the earth. To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood, "{Revelation 1: 5}

"{Colossians 2:11,12}
