Edward T. Dahlberg, minister of the Delmar Baptist Church of St. Louis, MO, recently visited the Central Church of Christ in that same city. He gave his impression of the visit over his weekly radio program on KSF the "Protestant Hour, " offering to mail his impression to any of his listeners. I went home inspired and said it was good to be in the house of the Lord today."

One would think such a profound experience could convince this man to examine his own practices in light of God's word. What had this church done except follow the pattern of New Testament Christianity. Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 16:1,2; Ephesians 5:19; Acts 2:42.
