Is the church better off today than ten years ago?

Moral decay is permeating the church, and a lack of attention to worldliness is allowing the world's standards to become the standards among God's children. Sin is not just for some TV evangelists any more. Elders and preachers, or their wives, are committing adultery or engaged in other forms of worldliness. We have churches in which elders are unqualified, and preachers are unwilling to do the work of an evangelist. Loose preaching on such subjects as divorce and remarriage have allowed Christians to believe that they can follow the world's example and still be pleasing to God. When are we going to "wake up"? Honestly, brethren, what does God think?

Sadly, what has happened, it seems in many of the congregations of the Lord's people, many have lost their spiritual appetites for book, chapter and verse preaching. Preachers who firmly, squarely and straight forwardly name sin and the consequences of members participating in them are branded as ineffective. Unfortunately, many are craving shorter sermons, no negative subjects from the pulpits and more humor and less substance. Preachers are now judged more on how long they preach (or short really) and if they are a great public speaker. Excuse me, did I miss something? Did the world become more godly and now there is a need for less pinpointed direct preaching in the pulpits today?
