## LOSING OUR YOUNG PEOPLE

During the last few years many parents have become brokenhearted over their children going the way of the world. Why does it happen? Consider some of these reasons.

**Lack of Proper Training**. "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it." {Proverbs 22:6} Do our children inherit our faith? Faith comes from hearing God-not us. Romans 10:17 In our homes we should be teaching not only by taking them to services but by the lives we live. "{1 Thessalonians 5:21,22} Influences and temptations are all around our children — TV, movies, music, and peer pressure. Parents must limit the amount of these evil influences in their children's lives. No, we can't place them in a protective bubble-but we can help them make good choices.
