GOD ANSWERS JOB

"Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind, and said: Who is this who darkens counsel by words without knowledge? Now prepare yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer Me." {Job 38:1-3} Job just thought if he could question God and understand His reasoning, then he could endure the difficult situations he found himself in. Really ?

Do you remember the story of Job? Satan was walking "to and fro" upon the earth and God asked him if he had "considered my servant Job." Satan answered, "Does Job fear God for nothing? Once I have spoken, but I will not answer; Yes, twice, but I will proceed no further." {Job 40:3-5} "I know that You can do everything.
