"...FOR THE PEOPLE SPARED THE BEST"

Many remember the story of King Saul and the battle with the Amalekites. God commanded Saul to; "Thus says the LORD of hosts: 'I will punish Amalek for what he did to Israel, how he ambushed him on the way when he came up from Egypt. Now go and attack Amalek, and utterly destroy all that they have, and do not spare them. But kill both man and woman, infant and nursing child, ox and sheep, camel and donkey." {1 Samuel 15:2,3} The instructions could not have been more plain!

Do you recall what Saul did? When he came to Samuel, Saul said to him, "Then Samuel went to Saul, and Saul said to him, Blessed are you of the LORD! I have performed the commandment of the LORD." {1 Samuel 15:13} Yet, when Samuel heard the lowing of the oxen, and bleating of the sheep, the truth was known! Saul had disobeyed God!

Saul compounds his sin. How? By telling Samuel the people were going to take these things and offer sacrifices unto God. "Then Samuel said: Has the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, As in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, And to heed than the fat of rams." {1 Samuel 15:22} God demands and expects obedience first! This Saul had failed in miserably.

What can we learn from this lesson of the past? Many people today in the religious world would do well to restudy this story. A simple fact of truth lies in Saul's sin. God will not tolerate disobedience, no matter how we rationalize our actions!

Today many are hoping God will accept what He would not receive from the hands of Saul. Men believe if it is for "a good cause", that will be enough. Will it? Surely to offer sacrifices was a worthy intention. Yet, can we disobey one of His commands, to do another? Heaven forbid it!!

Jesus Himself tells us , "If you love Me, keep my commandments." {John 14:15} Simply put, just do what I ask of you. No more, no less! By so doing, we display a proper attitude towards His word. Can anything be so easy to understand? If you look around in the world, it must be difficult to comprehend.
