WORK FOR THE NIGHT IS COMING

"I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work." {John 9:4}

Whenever I read this passage, my mind goes back to the short period of Jesus' public ministry. How long was this period? For three years Jesus had what many consider his "public ministry", following His baptism by John. Yet, what wonderful things He accomplished in a short time! Let us look at some of them.

The call of the 12. "And when He had called His twelve disciples to Him, He gave them power over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease. Now the names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Lebbaeus, whose surname was Thaddaeus; Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot, who also betrayed Him." {Matthew 10:1-4}

"And He said to them, Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." {Matthew 4:19}

"I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one." {John 17:15} God's special disciples, who would become the apostles, had a very important work to do after His departure—spreading the gospel and gaining souls into His kingdom!

Miracles of Jesus. While Jesus was on the earth He cast out demons, Mark 1:23-26; healed the demon-possessed, blind and mute man, Matthew 12:22,23; fed the five thousand, Mark 6:35-44; healed the nobleman's son, John 4:46-54; made the blind see, Mark 8:22-26; and He raised Lazarus from the dead, John 11:34-46. He did many other works, but you see the point of the good He accomplished. Surely this should have convinced men He came from God. Nicodemus understood, John 3:1-5.
