WHERE SHOULD I GO?

One Saturday I was sitting at home watching one of the football games on TV. Our doorbell rang, and a young man was standing there. "**Hi, my name is Zane and I'm here to discuss God and His word with you**." He then explained he was a Jehovah Witness. I invited him in and we began to talk.

Zane informed me he was once a Baptist. Why did he leave them? "I could see that they were not really Bible believing people." (At this point I'm thinking to myself, and the Jehovah Witnesses are?) So then I had to ask what made him feel the Jehovah Witness people were "true Bible believers."

"I noticed in the Baptist church, people were just really concerned to get you to be a member. Following your baptism (for entrance into the Baptist church, I might add) people just forgot you. When I started talking with the Jehovah Witnesses they really took the time to teach me. I could see their aim was for me to completely understand what being a Witness was all about. No one rushed me to the water. **Following my obedience, the teaching not only did not stop, but increased!**"

I could not help but think, as this young man spoke to me, the words of Jesus " ... Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature.
