One of the character traits God's word tells His children to have is "**fervency**." Defining it means "**having great emotion or zeal**; ardent." Let's see how we can apply this trait in our lives.

Fervent in Prayer. "Epaphras, who is one of you, a bondservant of Christ, greets you, always laboring fervently for you in prayers that you may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God." {Colossians 4:12} Christians should be fervent in offering their prayers to God- Thanksgiving, praise, our daily needs, the needs of others and help in times of weakness.

And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing." {1 Corinthians 13:1-3}
