FOUR ASPECTS OF LOVE

Let's briefly examine **four aspects** of God's love:

The Son's love for the Father. "I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do." (John 17:4) Christ demonstrated His love for the Father by doing His will on earth. Christ always gave the Father credit for all He did and accomplished while on earth.

These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full. This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."1 {John 15:10-12} All that Christ did on earth demonstrated His love for the saints. This love continues and will until time on earth is no more; then it will go on throughout eternity.

The Saints' love for one another. "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this, all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34,35) John wrote much about this special love that must exist between brethren. "We love Him because He first loved us. If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen? And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loves God must love his brother also."
