## **BAD FEELINGS AMONG GOD'S PEOPLE**

The wise man Solomon once said, "**there was nothing new under the sun**". Mankind will continue to have difficulty in dealing with problems between themselves. Yet, this is not to be so among God's people. Sadly, I've seen firsthand this is not always the case.

God's word concerning our conduct in this area is too plain for any to misunderstand. Please give careful attention to these passages:

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." {John 13:34,35}

"He who says he is in the light, and hates his brother, is in darkness until now. "{1 John 2:9}

"Whoever hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him." {1 John 3:15}

"If someone says, 'I love God, and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen?" {1 John 4:20} Can these passages make it any plainer?

What about brethren we disagree with? Does our conduct towards them change?

"And if anyone does not obey our word in this epistle, note that person and do not keep company with him, that he may be ashamed. Yet do not count him as an enemy, but admonish him as a brother." {2 Thessalonians 3:14,15}

Paul wrote the first book of Corinthians to a group he rebuked very strongly. Many of their practices Paul commanded them to change. How did he feel about these brethren?

"I thank my God always concerning you for the grace of God which was given to you by Christ Jesus, "{1 Corinthians 1:4} Say what Paul? Thank God for them? How could he? Does this surprise you?
