For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. {Matthew 6:19-21}

"But if anyone does not especially for those of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever."{1Timothy 5:8}

"Command those who are rich in this present age not to be haughty, nor to trust in uncertain riches but in the living God, who gives us richly all things to enjoy.
