THE THREEFOLD CORD OF LOVE

Today, we want to examine the "threefold" cord of love woven throughout the Scriptures.

God's Love for the World – Universal "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."
