THREE CLASSES OF PEOPLE AT MARS HILL

Today, we examine the three different classes of people who heard Paul's sermons at Mars Hill in Athens.

Mockers. "And when they heard of the resurrection of the dead, some mocked ..." {Acts 17:32} The word mock means" to treat with ridicule or contempt; deride." The mockers discounted Paul's teaching regarding the resurrection. Many today make mockery of the truth in God's word. Yet, one day when they die or the Lord returns - the mockers will come to know the truth! At this very moment, no mockers are in the graves-they've all been silenced.

Procrastinators. "... while others said, We will hear you again on this matter." {Acts 17:32} The word procrastinate means" to put off doing something, especially out of habitual carelessness or laziness; to postpone or delay needlessly."
