Self-Righteous Men—Offended by Atonement. "For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. For scarcely for a righteous man will one die; yet perhaps for a good man someone would even dare to die. But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him. For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life. And not only that, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation." {Romans 5:6-11} The cross presents the vicarious atonement of Christ for the world's sins; this offends the self-righteous. Some are unwilling to admit their sinful conditions and the shame that accompanies sin. Sadly, they are unwilling to acknowledge their need for a Savior.

God's word clearly voices the foolishness of concluding that any of us is without sin. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." {Romans 3:23} "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us." {1 John 1:8} People must swallow their pride and accept their sinful state and the remedy God offers by way of Calvary's events—it's our only hope.
