## **EVERYONE MUST CHOOSE—ONE WAY OR ANOTHER (2)**

Every coin has two sides. Now let us examine what we need to look for if we are seeking to make a **BETTER** choice.

**Two Guides**. One can choose man's opinions or, by faith, trust God's truth. "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways, says the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts." {Isaiah 55:8,9} Sometimes, men's ways seem to be the right ways {Proverbs 14:12}. If we allow God to guide us, we follow a tested and proven way. "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him." {Hebrews 11:6} God always leads us down paths that will bring good into our lives. He never directs us to follow hurtful paths. Human guides are forever changing according to human whims and thinking. They want to please the majority and are unconcerned about whether or not they please God. One guide cares about you—the other does not. **CHOOSE**.

**Two Authorities**. Men's creeds or the Bible alone. "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers; and they will turn their ears away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables." {2 Timothy 4:3,4} Men's creeds seek to please those who sit in the pews. They accomplish this by giving them what they demand instead of what they need. They consider their wisdom as being superior to God's. In essence each person is their own authority to do what they determine in their lives. The Bible is inspired. "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work." {2 Timothy 3:16,17} Following any other course is following a perversion of the truth {Galatians 1:6-9}.
